Open Public Hearing on 2017-2018 Budget Amendment: The mayor opened the public hearing and the clerk reported that no written or oral comments were received regarding the published notice. Hearing no other comments, Dee Cook motioned, Rob Davis seconded to close the public hearing. Ayes all. Motion carried and the hearing was closed.

REPORTS:

Ambulance Report: Koch reported 16 calls for the month and presented a proposal from Zoll regarding the purchase of a 2nd monitor for the 2nd ambulance and requested hotel, mileage, and training for Lonni, Mike, Mary Sue to attend IEMSA November 9-11. Dee Cook motioned, Dee Taylor seconded to approve purchasing the two monitors (\$55,121.53) from Zoll with the one being paid for now with the Firehouse Sub grant money received, the second one to be paid for with next year's budget and to check with Stanwood to see if they would be interested in purchasing the trade in monitor(s) at the \$2500 that Zoll is allowing. Ayes all. Motion carried.

Fire Report: Koch reported 9 calls, Joe Hunt returning as an EMT and FF2 as he has retired from Cedar Rapids, Adam and Kaleb will be retaking FF1 test at CITA and Chino will be attending CITA 1 day of class, and 1 day as instructor. Also reported that inventory of gear for volunteers is low so will be needing to purchase some items.

Police report: Tim Horihan gave his summary of activity from 8/15/17 to 9/11/17 which included 43 business checks; 5 agency assists; 17 citizen assist; 1 motorist assist; 4 general public safety; 1 burglary/breaking and entering; 1 vandalism; 1 warrant;1 assault; 4 suspicious activity; 4 animal cases; 3 juvenile cases; 1 welfare check; 2 civil cases; 7 Nuisance/Noise; 1 community event; 3 training; 11 parking violations; 22 traffic stops; 27 warnings; and 14 citations.

Public Works Report: Lange absent. Lange and Albaugh each requested five vacation days. Motion by Oberbreckling second by Davis to approve. Ayes all. Motion carried.

Administration Report: Coppess reported receiving a grant from the Cedar County EMS Association for \$605 to reimburse city for training expenses paid and completed the application for the IDNR Forest Grant to be reimbursed for fire expenditures up to \$3500. Four vacation days were requested and approved with a motion by Dee Taylor and second by Dee Cook. Ayes all. Motion carried. The policy for placing rock in the alleys was reviewed and confirmed that the city will haul, the property owners will pay for the rock.

Old business discussion and possible action on:

Wyoming Waste Water Treatment facility reports: Copies of the reports were provided. Lange will review at next meeting.

Cedar County Great Places: Phone conference meeting tomorrow from 3-4 p.m. Information and agenda was provided to Mayor and council.

New business discussion and possible action on:

Resolution 2017-12 adopting 2017-2018 Budget Amendment: Rob Davis motioned, Dee Cook seconded to approve the resolution adopting the 2017-2018 Budget amendment. Ayes: Cook, Davis, Taylor, Oberbreckling. Nays: None. Absent: Cavey. Resolution adopted.

Proposal to repair X40(N Elm) roadway south of intersection at E Second Street:

Proposal was received from Oberbreckling and Sons to tear out and replace 80' x 23'x8" deep with re-rod reinforced section of X40 for \$12,960.00. Discussion on whether or not it should be thicker concrete. Clerk was asked to check with JJJ Enterprises to see how thick it was when they cut through for the water pipe. Dee Taylor motioned, Dee cook seconded, to accept the proposal if it was 8" or less and if it was originally thicker than the 8" it would be rebid. Ayes: Taylor, Cook, and Oberbreckling. Nays: Davis. Absent: Cavey. Motion approved. (Note: Following meeting, found out there was no concrete where they cut through only 6-7 inches of asphalt. Also Lange brought in a price estimate from LL Pelling the next morning to mill and fill intersection with 60 ton of MHA surface Mix for a total cost of \$15,910.)
